We were happy to have literature and posters submitted by Municipal Alcohol Project regarding the Youth Alcohol Project this year as well.

Interest was shown from adults and youth alike who stopped by our booth. Youth distributed material on the mainway also.

A number of youth marched in the parade (even those who had already graduated came back to help us!) with facilitator and outreach, and were accompanied by Bridgewater Police Services School Safety Officer, Cst. Paul Rogers, and by Lunenburg County RCMP officer Cst. Angela MacEachern, with vehicles. Thanks to the Park Patrol youth who accompanied us as well.
