- \Rightarrow Selection made by screening committee

Mission Statement

The Verge House is a program that provides students with disabilities or special needs an opportunity to:

- Improve overall quality of life
- Optimize independence
- Become integrated in their community
- Become empowered in their lives and become productive members of society

Benefits of Transition Program Skills Training:

- Allows students to begin experiencing adult life activities in the community while having the support of the school system
- Where appropriate, allows students to gain work experience or expand work responsibilities
- Allows students to participate in community-based recreational/leisure activities
- Allows students to further develop independent living skills and develop social connections in the environments they will be interacting with as young adults
- Allows students to explore options and begin to "try out" their vision of life as an adult
