

Parent Communication Embedded Collaborative Learning Time

During the past two years, 16 schools have adopted the Embedded Collaborative Learning Time model to enhance professional learning for teachers. There is overwhelming evidence that student learning and student engagement increase when teachers have opportunities to work together as Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). A recent evaluation of the collaborative learning teams from all current schools indicates that teachers are engaged in valuable learning and are adjusting their teaching practices to improve student engagement and achievement.

In 2014-2015, the Park View feeder system will join all other schools by implementing Embedded Collaborative Learning Teams.

What will "embedded collaborative learning time" look like?

- ✓ On designated days of the school year, the school day will be reduced by 90 instructional minutes for staff to collaborate and engage in professional learning.
- ✓ To support the early dismissal dates, instructional time will be extended by an average of seven to 10 minutes each day for the entire school year.
- ✓ The added daily instructional time will allow for 14 ninety-minute early dismissals per school year on various afternoons (schedule below).

The Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (EECD) has been a leader in working with the following partners to review research and develop a framework for moving forward with embedded collaborative learning time:

Benefits to students and their families include:

- ✓ Decrease in the number of times teachers will be away from their students for professional development
- ✓ Enhanced examination of student work so supports are in place sooner
- ✓ Continued support for inquiry-based learning and student engagement
- ✓ Increased student achievement in all areas, including math and literacy
- ✓ Improved assessment practices
- ✓ Issues, such as cyber bullying and the development of social emotional competencies of students, are more effectively addressed
- ✓ A classroom environment that allows students to work from their preferred learning styles and talents

Principals and Regional staff consulted with school staffs and their SACs and developed a modified schedule that will begin in the 2014-2015 school year.

- ✓ On average in the feeder system, the day will be lengthened by an average of seven to 10 minutes each day for the entire school year, through extending and reorganizing the school day. Daily instruction in Nova Scotia can vary between 240 and 360 minutes per day in grades primary to 2, including recess; and between 300 and 360 minutes per day in grades 3 to 6, including recess; and between 300 and 360 in grades 7 to 12, not including recess.
- ✓ On designated days throughout the school year (schedule below), students will be dismissed early. Staff will remain at school for collaborative learning time after the students leave. This structured time will be used to examine student achievement data and to plan for specific strategies to improve student learning and student engagement.
