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CAFETERIA ASSESSMENTS SPRING 2016

- RESULTS SHOWED
 - PROCURING OUR FOOD AS ONE UNIT RATHER THAN INDIVIDUAL UNITS.
 - SOURCE MORE LOCALLY PRODUCED FOOD.
 - CHALLENGES
 - WORKING CONDITIONS FOR FOOD SERVICE STAFF;
 - IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SCHOOL FOOD AND NUTRITION POLICY;
 - AND ECONOMIC VIABILITY
 - LACK OF PROFIT OR SALES
 - HEALTHIER FOOD WAS A SEEN AS A BARRIER TO HAVING A POSITIVE CAFETERIA BUDGET
 - SOME FELT THAT THE CURRENT MODEL WAS A CHALLENGE:
 - INCONSISTENCIES BETWEEN SCHOOLS
 - PRINCIPALS ARE EDUCATORS, NOT SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS
 - THE COST OF FEEDING STUDENTS IN NEED IS GETTING HIGHER IN MANY SCHOOL COMMUNITIES

SUGGESTIONS MADE FOR THE VIABILITY OF ALL CAFETERIAS IN THE SCHOOL BOARD

- MORE STANDARDIZATION AND CONSISTENCY ACROSS THE SCHOOL
 - ACHIEVED BY CENTRALIZING SOME OF THE PURCHASING AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CAFETERIAS
- SETTING THE GOAL OF JUST BREAKING EVEN OR BEING PROFITABLE ENOUGH
 - THE CAFETERIA IS ABLE TO SERVE HEALTHY FOOD, REFRESH EQUIPMENT, PAY STAFF AND FEED CHILDREN WHO COME WITHOUT LUNCH
- ONGOING FUNDING FOR FOOD SERVICES TO BE ABLE TO CONTINUE TO OPERATE, AND ACHIEVE BREAKING EVEN POINT

 - THESE FIGURES DO NOT REFLECT THE AMOUNT SPENT TO PROVIDE FOOD FOR CHILDREN WITHOUT LUNCHES.
- THE AMOUNT SPENT TO FEED HUNGRY CHILDREN IN SCHOOLS RANGES FROM \$100.00 TO \$700.00 PER MONTH WHICH IS ESTIMATED AT \$54,552 PER YEAR ACROSS THE SCHOOL BOARD.
