What New Teachers Are Saying About Us




Kaitlin Yeaton

Stella Bowles

Park View Education Centre grade 11 student, Stella Bowles, was recently awarded the Order of Nova Scotia, making her the youngest recipient to ever receive the award.

Stella was a grade six student at Bridgewater Elementary School when a science fair assignment turned into a passion project. After learning many homes had illegal straight pipes that permitted sewage to flow directly into the LaHave River, Stella set out to make a change to make the river safe to swim in.

The community got behind her cause and it drew national attention. Stella's commitment to cleaning the LaHave River influenced a \$15.7 million dollar clean-up project that is currently underway and funded by the federal, provincial, and municipal governments.



Valerie Sia

In 2019, 11-year-old Valerie Sia won the Young Citizens Award. The Bridgewater Junior High student created a four-minute video that explored the legacy and treatment of Chinese labourers who immigrated to 19-th century Canada to help build the railways.

Sia had a personal connection to the subject, having ancestors from Malaysia that came to North America to work as rubber plantation workers and under similar conditions to the Chinese railway workers.

The project took her two months to complete and involved a variety of research. The Young Citizens program is a national contest that sees students create engaging and inspiring history projects and winners receive the award at a ceremony in Ottawa.
