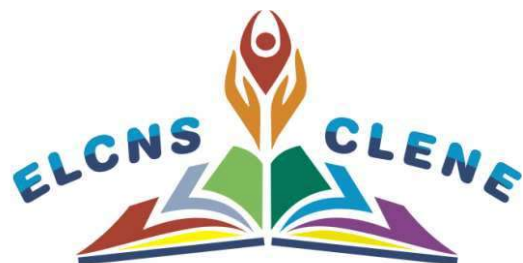

What is the Aspiring Leaders Program?

The Aspiring Leaders Program (ALP) is offered by the Nova Scotia Department of Education and Early Childhood Development in partnership with the Educational Leadership Consortium of Nova Scotia (ELCNS) and school regions. The goal of the Program is to provide leadership training and skill development to aspiring school administrators. The ALP extends over 14 months and leads to a certificate. The certificate is granted by the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development in partnership with the ELCNS and regional centres/boards.

Who is the target audience?

The Nova Scotia Aspiring Leaders Program is designed for teachers, mentors, department heads, and regional centre/ board consultants who are interested in becoming school principals and/or vice principals.



What are the Components of the Aspiring Leaders Program?

Summer Institute #1: August 12-13, 2024:

- *Day 1 - Program orientation and Insights Discovery*
- *Day 2 - ELCNS Summer Leadership Conference*

Friday/Saturday Seminars:

1. School Culture and Building Relationships (September TBD, 2024)
 2. Communication Skills (October TBD, 2024)
 3. School Management (November TBD, 2024) *
 4. Instructional Leadership (January TBD, 2025) *

Residency Program: Eight Days

The Residency Program, offered September to September, incorporates the learning and skills from each of the seven Seminars and Summer Institutes.

Culminating Assessment Fall 2025:

A Culminating Assessment, providing the proteges an opportunity to demonstrate what they know and have learned, will be conducted in Fall of 2025, and must be successfully completed.

Where and when?

Summer Institute #1 will be held in Dartmouth, August 12-13, 2024

Seminars will be held with Friday sessions starting at 1:00 pm and full-day Saturday sessions.

Seminars will be held in the following months:

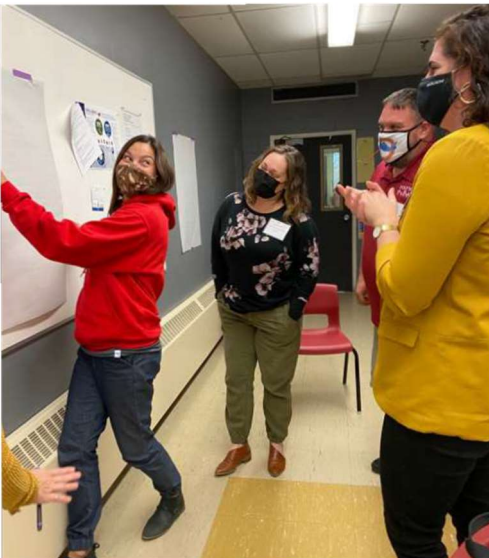
September, October, November*, January*, February*, April and May.

Residency Programs will be held within individual school regions/boards.



How do I apply?

Apply on-line on your region's/board's website or contact the region's/board's ALP contact for information.

Applicants must provide three professional, work-related references that include their current supervisor. Regional centre/board staff will review applications and make selections based on identified criteria. All applicants will be notified following the selection process.

Short-listed, screened-in applicants will be interviewed by a panel of region/board personnel. The interview may include a series of questions, a presentation and/or a performance task. The interview panel will make the final selection of successful candidates.

Debriefing opportunities for unsuccessful applicants are available upon request. All applicants will be considered based on quality of the application, references, and in response to the Region's/Board's identified needs.

The cost of the program per participant is \$2,115 + HST for the two summer institutes and the seven seminars. Participants must also pay for and attend the *ELCNS Summer Leadership* conference.
